Rev. Ross Writes...

The great story we look at today is David bringing the Ark of the Covenant into Jerusalem. The Lectionary edits the story a bit by leaving out the dramatic story of Uzzah

being struck dead because he put his hand on the Ark. I don't think the story is edited out because it's difficult and casts God in a strange light. I think it's been edited out because of all the popular mythology surrounding ancient artifacts of power - the Indiana Jones effect. Rather than ascribing power to God, people can easily fall into the trap of thinking the power is in the artifact itself. That is certainly the mythology behind the Indiana Jones story and the tales of people looking for the spear that killed Jesus, the Holy Grail, and other relics from Biblical stories. Instead of praising God, people look for magic or supernatural power.

The Ark was said to contain the tablets on which the Ten Commandments were written – the second set as Moses had already broken the first set – a sample of manna, the rod of Aaron. Not magical items or even items of power, but symbols of the presence of God. Carrying the Ark with them, the people knew the presence of God was with them. The story of Uzzah being struck down is not about the Ark having power, it's about Uzzah not respecting the presence of God. Some scholars say it is because Uzzah was not ritually prepared, but that is almost the same thing. He did not respect that this was God's presence and God was guite able to look after the Ark, given all the Ark had been through, a little oxen stumble wasn't a threat. No magic, no need for Indiana Jones to go searching, just a lesson in respecting the presence of God.

No one knows what happened to the Ark, it was presumably taken by the Babylonians when they ransacked Jerusalem, but after that there is no trace. And that is a good thing, because it stops people looking for magical items as a distraction from looking to God in faith.
