Rev. Ross Writes...

I have often wished that God would just pull apart the clouds and say, clearly and loudly to everyone, "Here I am, believe in me!" While it's an interesting thought, there are many stories in the Bible that show that it wouldn't work; people are too self-focused for such an event to have an impact for more than a day. "Oh

that! It was just an advertising stunt, or a strange thunderstorm, or sun reflecting off a weather balloon".

God speaks to Jesus and the disciples and people think it was thunder. The people of Israel saw the wonderful acts of God in bringing about their release from slavery, including the wonders at the sea, and yet, as soon as Moses is away up the mountain, they melt all their gold and make an idol! And in today's reading from John's Gospel, we see a similar fading of memory. The crowd chase after Jesus because they experienced the miracle of being fed, and yet, when Jesus starts talking about believing in the One sent by God, the first thing they say is, "What sign are you going to give to us, so that we may see it and believe in you?" Short term memory problem? Or a sample of human nature; it's hard for us to hold onto something that isn't immediately in front of us.

We remember great experiences, a camp or a worship service where we felt close to God, and call them 'mountain top experiences', because we notice how quickly they fade when we get back to real life, the bottom of the mountain. But if we acknowledge this quirk of being human, we can start working on the 'faith muscles' that can keep us connected to our memories of God's presence and blessing. We can hold onto the mountaintops as a way to help us navigate life. And, if we hold onto faith and hope and love, we can see and experience mountaintops all around us as we walk with God.
