Rev. Ross Writes...



While we will skip James Chapter 2 this week, with worship focussing on Chapter 3, there is an important lesson in James talking about favouritism.

For if a man wearing a gold ring and fine clothing comes into your assembly, and a poor man in shabby clothing also comes in, and if you pay attention to the one who wears the fine clothing and say, "You sit here in a good place," while you say

to the poor man, "You stand over there," or "Sit down at my feet," have you not then made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts?

There is a clear connection to Jesus' ministry; born amongst the animals in Bethlehem and not in a fine house in Jerusalem, healing and feeding the poor and the destitute, not dining with the wealthy. But there is also a lesson about the true nature of God's blessings. There is a deeply imbedded myth in the human heart; wealth and health are signs of God's blessing. That is at the heart of the favouritism that James is writing about. To counter it, James writes, "Has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich in faith?" A clear reminder of Jesus' ministry, and God's real blessings, right back to releasing the people from Egyptian slavery. And to drive the lesson home, in a more subversive way, he adds "Is it not the rich who oppress you?" Wealth maybe a blessing from God, but the wealthy quickly forget God and focus on their wealth, believing it to be deserved. Another tie in James to the teachings of Jesus; "You cannot serve two masters; you cannot serve both God and wealth."

How timeless is this lesson in this era of Prosperity Gospel and the Prayer of Jabez, of churches that operate on respectability and others that run on opulence. How easy it is to forget that God has chosen the poor to be rich in faith, and that our mission is not to accumulate wealth but to use our resources for the poor, for the ill, and for those in need. The very practical James offers lessons that are not to be relegated to the first century.
