

I think we underestimate how society shaking the early church was in the cities around the Mediterranean. In cultures where people kept to themselves, their caste, class, and iob. And into that understanding of society came the new Christian communities that said, "The Gospel is for everyone. All are welcome." For the first time, slaves and slave owners. rich and poor.

tradesman and beggars, were sitting side by side and sharing in worship. It's no wonder that the letters of Paul, James, and Peter have so many mentions of quarrels, conflicts, and subgroups. As well as learning about this new faith that they had been captured by, they had to learn how to be a community. So, when Paul writes to the new communities in Galatia, saying, "There is neither Jew nor gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for all are one in Christ Jesus", this is not just theology about moving from a faith based in Law to a faith based in Christ, this is a call to community. A call to equality before God that overwrites all our ideas of hierarchy and class and race. With that background, scripture open a whole new insight into human behaviour and community development.

All these centuries later we seem to have forgotten that lesson, with so many of our church communities being distinctly mono-cultural, with the universal nature of the Gospel being relegated to evangelism and church planting. Can we regain, and live, that wonderful, gracious, message that all are welcome, not just people like us?

It will be a pleasure to welcome to our Moderator and friend, Rev. David Fotheringham, to worship next week in a combined service.
